In the Draft Watershed Plan for Palouse & H.J., a very important item is listed. Designating a 3<sup>rd</sup> party contractor partially funded by the present drilling co. & in coordination with Stakeholders. For the County <sup>Energy</sup> Master Plan this should include any involved gas & oil drilling co. to prepare & conduct a water quality & quantity monitoring program in the drilling lease area. The collection, sampling & baseline inventory program will be designated such that the data collected will be used to prepare the monitoring plan. This plan & data collected will be available to the public & will be included in all plans & development.

There needs to be surface monitoring stations, ground water monitoring wells in strategic locations. Conduct immediate follow-up sampling for anomalous results. Collect produced water samples from each well within 6 months of final well completion & on an annual basis.

There needs to be an emergency response plan - hazardous materials management, spill prevention control & special concerns for health & safety -
