## ***Current Openings***

### ***Agricultural Advisory Panel***

Deadline for application: Ongoing until filled  
Term: Two years

Pursuant to Resolution MCM 97-132 establishing a Right to Farm and Ranch Policy. The panel assists the Board of Mesa County Commissioners in resolving agricultural issues by determining whether an agricultural practice is historical, traditional, legitimate and reasonable. Candidates must be residents of Mesa County and have a working knowledge of production agriculture.

### ***Board of Adjustment***

Deadline for application: Ongoing until filled  
Term: Three years

Pursuant to C.R.S. 30-28-117 and Mesa County Land Development Code. The Board has the authority to make special exceptions to the terms of the zoning regulations. May also interpret zoning maps and pass upon disputed appeals by persons aggrieved by their inability to obtain a building permit or by the decision of any administrative officer or agency made in the course of the administration or enforcement of the provisions of the zoning resolution.

### **Citizen Review Panel**

Deadline for application: Ongoing until filled

Term: One year

Pursuant to C.R.S. 19-3-211(1) (b), 1997 and Mesa County Resolution MCM 98-209, this panel was created to provide a conflict resolution process. This five-member panel will assist the Board of Mesa County Commissioners by providing a conflict resolution process for grievances concerning the conduct of the County Department of Human Services personnel. Demonstrable personal or professional knowledge and experience with children required.

### **Colorado State University (CSU) Extension Tri River Area Advisory Board**

Deadline for application: Ongoing until filled

Term: Three years

The Colorado Cooperative Extension Act authorizes Boards of County Commissioners to establish county advisory committees to assist local Extension personnel in planning, developing long- range objectives, establishing priorities, and evaluating programs and performance.

### **Noxious Weeds Advisory Board**

Deadline for application: Ongoing until filled

Term: Three years

Pursuant to Mesa County resolution MCM 97-191 and amendment MCM 2010-091, the Mesa County Weed Advisory Board will make recommendations to the Mesa County Board of County Commissioners regarding a recommended management plan for designated noxious weeds, declare noxious weeds and any state designated noxious weeds to be subject to management, and undertake other tasks as request.

Mandated by the Colorado Noxious Weed Act, Title 35 Article 5.5, "The members of each local advisory board shall be residents of the unincorporated portion of the County" and "at least a majority shall be landowners of at least forty (40) acres. Designate a seven (7) member board with five (5) voting members and two (2) of the members acting as alternates, all members serving three (3) year terms.
