

# 🗶 Marijuana in Mesa County 🗶




Amendment 64, legalizing recreational marijuana use in Colorado, was passed in November 2012. Commercial sale of recreational marijuana began January 1, 2014.


What is

Marijuana is a green, brown leafy mixture from a cannabis plant. When smoked or consumed, the psychoactive chemical (THC or delta-9marijuana? tetrahydrocannabinol) is absorbed by the body's fatty tissue and enters the brain. The THC triggers the brain's reward system.1

43% of adults in Mesa County report having used marijuana one or more times during their life.2







## **Youth and Marijuana Use**

## Methods of Use Reported by High School Students <sup>3</sup>

#### Significantly higher 97.3%\* among Mesa County 100 students compared to Colorado 90 80 70 60 50 38.3% 32.9% 40 30 20 10 Method of Use Smoking Dabbing Eating Vaping Other

(e.g. pipe, joint)

#### Methods of Use 5

#### Smoking:



Flower (bud) from marijuana plant is burned and the smoke is inhaled.

Takes seconds to minutes to take effect.

### Vaping:



THC extract is heated and the vapor is inhaled.

Takes seconds to minutes to take effect.

#### Topical:



THC extract is added to products and applied to the skin.

Non-psychoactive form of use.

#### Ingesting:



THC extract is added to food or drink to be ingested.

Takes 90 minutes to 4 hours to take effect.

#### Dabbing:



THC extract is heated and the vapor is inhaled.
Can obtain up to 60-80% THC.
Takes seconds to minutes to take effect.
